The lesion may present as a coarse or fine red line or as a punctum with radiating limbs. One subgroup is termed “Spider naevus” (Syn: *Asterisk naevus*, *Naevus araneus*, *Capillary angioma*, etc.) due to its stellate (web-like) radiations.

Refer Aur.383 “Remarkable agitation of blood [Auffallende Wallung im Blute], as if it boiled in all the arteries (aft. 24h).”; Kali-c.1464 “Ebullition in the blood, and heat in the head.”, 1465 “Ebullition in the blood, in the evening, before going to sleep, with oppression and tightness in the chest.”; Lyc.1408 “Ebullition of blood, so that everything in the blood-vessels is in agitation.”; Merc.1112 “Much anxiety and ebullition in the blood at night, and stitching in the blood-vessels.”
- 656 Blut-Fülle (Plethora) (vergl. Vollsaftigkeit) [TTm162,322] (duplicates). The rubric *Blut-Sammlung im Innern* (accumulation of blood in the interior) listed 5 remedies, which, except for Camph., all appeared in this present rubric – it has been removed, and the Camph. added in this place here. Refer *Amm-c.*498 “Heaviness of the chest, as if from accumulation of blood [Blut-Ansammlung] (4th, 5th, 7th d). [Ng]; *Cupr.*252 “Sensation of excessive accumulation of blood [Blut-Anhäufung] in the chest, without any palpitation.”; *Lyc.*168 “Fullness of blood [Blut-Fülle] in the occiput, after stooping.”; *Nit-ac.*89 “Pain as from fullness of blood [Blut-Fülle] in the head, the eyes, and in the upper part of the nose, when shaking the head, and blowing the nose.”; *Sulf.*249 “Sensation of fullness of blood [Blut-Fülle] in the eyes.” From these examples, it seems this rubric refers to a congestion of blood, as if too full, whilst the following rubric, though similar, refers to a sensation as if the blood is actually surging, rushing to fill the part. This relationship is evidenced in the fact that all remedies in this present rubric, except Selenium, are also listed under *surging* below. From EWM, vol.27 (1842), pp.610-28, we read the following symptoms: “large, full pulse, redness, turgor of the face, and of the skin of the whole body, lively and fiery appearance, energetic...”, and this work further describes the specific congestive states, during pregnancy, of the uterus, etc.
- 657 Blut-Drang zu einzelnen Theilen [TTm161-2,321-22] (duplicates). Note discrepancy TTm162/TT140 list Viol-o. in grade 3, whereas TTm322/TT275 list it in grade 3-4 respectively – evidencing a printer’s typesetting error. Refer *Amm-c.*501 “Rush of blood to the chest (after writing) [Blutdrang nach der Brust (nach Schreiben)].”; Bell.186 “Rush of blood [Drang des Blutes] to the head, red cheeks. [B₅₁]”; *Sep.*1408 “Ebullition of blood, with rush of blood [Blut-Drang] toward head and chest (aft. 16d).”; *Nit-ac.*884 “Asthma, as from congestion of blood [Blutdrang] to the chest.”
- 658 Wogen, Gefühl von [TTm225]. Refer Hyos.44 [RA(32)] “An undulation [Wogen] in the brain as from violent beating of the arteries, with aching in the forehead; worst after stooping (aft. ½ h). [Wsl]”. From the above example, we see this term refers to a violent surging, more intense than that of ebullition. Indeed, this term is used to describe a slowly building up or welling-up “surge” as say in the building energy of a large wave (sea).
- 659 Blutungen aus inneren Theilen [TTm162-63]. Refer *Ant-c.*418 “Excessive hæmorrhages. [H₁₇₃]”; *Iod.*601 “Disposition to hæmorrhages. [x31]” Merc.630 “Hæmorrhage from the urethra [FrH]”; *Phos.*1633 “Discharge of blood from various parts of the body, as coughing blood, bleeding of the gums, of the varices ani, etc.”; Puls.472 “Severe hæmorrhage from the anus (aft. 7d). [FrH]”.
- 660 Blut-Mangel [TTm162,322]. Note typeset error TT276 did not list three medicines present in its TTm322 counterpart (Bov. Bry. Calc.). These have been re-instated. Refer Acon.453 “Sensation as if the circulation in all the blood-vessels was impeded [gehemmt]. [B₃]”; *Nat-m.*1165 “Retarded circulation [Gehemmt Blutlauf] in the arm, when resting it on the table, and so it is often in all parts of the body.”; *Nit-ac.*1068 “After a walk, weakness in the left thigh, with sensation, as if the blood stagnated in it [als stockte das Blut darin].”, 1243 “The hands and limbs, when in a false position or when pressed upon, feel weary and paralysed, as if the circulation was checked [gehemmt] by a bandage (12th d). [Rm]”; *Phos.*1510 “The leg from the calf to the foot is asleep [Eingeschlafenheit], as if the circulation had been checked [Blutlauf gehemmt] below the knee by a tight ligature.”. This rubric refers to a pallor of the affected area, from reduced blood-flow (improper distribution of blood).
- 661 Blut-Stockungsgefühl [TTm162,322]. Note discrepancy TTm162 does not list *Sep.* which is listed under TTm322 [superadded – evidencing Bönninghausen realised this omission after having written the rubric, but forgot about going back to TTm162 and superadding it there also]. Refer *Caut.*1029 “The left arm grows rigid [Erstarren] when raised up over the head and held up for a time; it is as if the blood in it flowed back [als flösse das Blut darin zurück], and in the right side of the chest there is a pain, as if the muscles were shortened.”; *Hep.*253 “Sensation as of stagnation of blood [Blut-Stockung] in both hypochondria, at every step while walking.”; *Lyc.*1411 “Sensation as if the circulation stopped”;

- M-aus.217 "A pain in the arms as if the blood stagnated in the veins, sometimes on one spot, sometimes on another. [*Hsh*]"; *Sulf*.189 "Pain in the left side of the occiput, as from stagnation of blood [Blut-Stockung], on awaking from sleep."; *Zinc*.1150 "Sensation of stagnation [Blutstockungs-Gefühl] of the circulation in the left lower limb, especially of the leg, frequently."
- 662 Puls, im Allgemeinen verändert [TTm323]. Refer J.W.Günst (GAHP58-61) who discusses the varieties and indications of the pulse. See also Laurie (LHP12-16).
- 663— unverändert [TTm323].
- 664— zu schnell [TTm323]. Refer Bell.1085 "Loss of all sensation; stiffness of the lower extremities; excessive distension of all the blood-vessels of the skin, with uncommonly red, swollen face, extremely full and rapid pulse and profuse sweat. [B,]", 1124 "Very deep sopor [Schlafsucht], with subsultus tendinum, pale cold face, cold hands, and hard, small, rapid pulse. [M_{17,1}]"; *Kali-n*.702 "Very quick pulse, in the afternoon while at rest, for an hour. [*Tze*]", Very rapid pulse at 4 p.m., with heat in the head for an hour (28th d). [*Tze*].

- 666— gross [TTm324].
- 667— hart [TTm324]. Note discrepancy TTm324/TT278 list Camph. in grade 2-1 respectively.
- 668— unfühlfbar [TTm325]. Refer Acon.500 "Along with bold speech and lively eyes [dreister Sprache und lebhaften Augen], cold sweat stands on the forehead, and the pulse is almost imperceptible. [M_{16,1}]"; Verat.582 [RA(311)] "Imperceptible [Unmerklicher] pulse. [R_{23,2}]", 584 [RA(312)] "The pulse of ordinary rapidity, but quite weak and almost imperceptible (aft. 8h). [*Bch*]".
- 669— ungleich (unregelmässig) [TTm323].
- 670— zu langsam [TTm324].
- 671— langsamer, als der Herzschlag [TTm324].
- 672— klein [TTm324]. Refer *Agar*.711 "The pulse, at other times strong and full, becomes small, weak and hardly perceptible. [*Apt*]"; *Ars*.87 "She lay in her bed perfectly senseless, muttered unintelligible sounds, with her eyes staring, cold perspiration on her forehead; trembling in her whole body; small, hard and quick pulse. [E_{1,1}]"; Bell.550 "Complete repugnance to all food and drink, with quick weak pulse. [G_{27,1,129}]"
- 673— weich [TTm324-25].
- g Fieber. In the days of Bönninghausen, "Fever" referred to any change in normal body temperature - either a heat or a chill. This section contains entries relating to various thermoregulatory abnormalities, and therefore has been titled appropriately. Note the section on "Pathological names of fevers" as found in TBR first editon, has, for reasons of grading inconsistency with TT proper, herein been removed, as those wishing to study more particularly this area should consult Bönninghausen's *Fevers* work.
